News

At the end of this month, there are some planned roadworks happening in the village which may affect busy school times such as drop off and collection times.

The road works will be happening in three stages:

Stage 1

Vicarage Hill section 29/1/24 to 4/2/24 inclusive. The road down to Holbeton from Luson Cross may be closed that week as the works extend a short way up Church Hill. During stage 1, you may wish to drive up to the school gate to drop your child off with a member of staff and then continue onwards on your journey which will reduce the number of cars turning around and causing congestion.

Roads affected -VICARAGE HILL [& A SMALL SECTION OF CHURCH HILL]., HOLBETON

The alternative, signed, route for vehicles will be via - CHURCH HILL - WONNELL BARN - LUSON CROSS - WONNELL BARN CROSS - CROCOMBE CROSS - MOORSHEAD CROSS - WONNELL BARN - MOORSHEADWOOD - FORD - VICARAGE HILL.

This temporary restriction is considered necessary to enable - **EXCAVATE AND INSTALL NEW SEWER PIPE**.




Stage 2

Village 'centre' section 5/2/24 to 11/2/24 inclusive. During this stage, the road down from Luson Cross will hopefully be open and cars will still be able to access Brent Hill and the village car park. Parents dropping off will be either to do so near the shop and walk down to the school from there or to go via Gibb and thereby come up from the Brownswell farm direction. If access is limited we will inform parents and ask them to drop children off at the Mildmay Colours Pub carpark where members of staff will be waiting. We will then have a walking bus to the school.

Roads affected -CHURCH HILL-THE SQUARE, HOLBETON

The alternative, signed, route for vehicles will be via - FORE STREET - GIBB COTTAGES - BRENT HILL - HIGHER BROWNSWELL.

This temporary restriction is considered necessary to enable - EXCAVATE AND INSTALL NEW SURFACE WATER SEWER.




Stage 3

Section in proximity to Holbeton Primary School (road at the front of the school building) 12/2/24 to 18/2/24. Exact length being closed to be clarified. We will inform parents if the works overruns and we need to provide a walking bus from the Mildmay Colours.

Roads affected -CHURCH HILL [EASTERN SIDE] - BRENT HILL TO HIGHER BROWNSWELL., HOLBETON

The alternative, signed, route for vehicles will be via - THE SQUARE - FORE STREET - GIBB COTTAGES - BRENT HILL - HIGHER BROWNSWELL.
