
we need parent help with transport. If you are able to help, please get in touch with Mrs Nash and we will confirm arrangements.

Year 1 and Year 2

This week Wonwell have been learning about measuring length and height this week and learning to read and use standard units of measure. To launch our History topic this half term we began thinking about where the things around us come from......what is an invention? Why was it invented? What was life like before it was invented and how has it made life better since it was invented? As you can imagine, we had ALOT to talk about and think about. We had a fantastic, thought provoking and inspiring discussion. The children then made or drew their chosen existing invention but had to make/design what it would be like in 50 years time - how would it have improved?



Year 3 and Year 4

This week, Mothecombe class have started our new topic 'Fractions'. We went outside and compared denominators to help us understand that the larger the denominator, the smaller the parts.



Year 5 and Year 6

Bigbury class worked really hard on their history learning this week! We learnt about sources from the Indus Valley that might tell us about how the civilisation was ruled and governed, and that they might have had a religion! We then compared this to what we already knew about Ancient Egypt. It was great to hear children confidently recalling their knowledge from the start of the year and making connections.
